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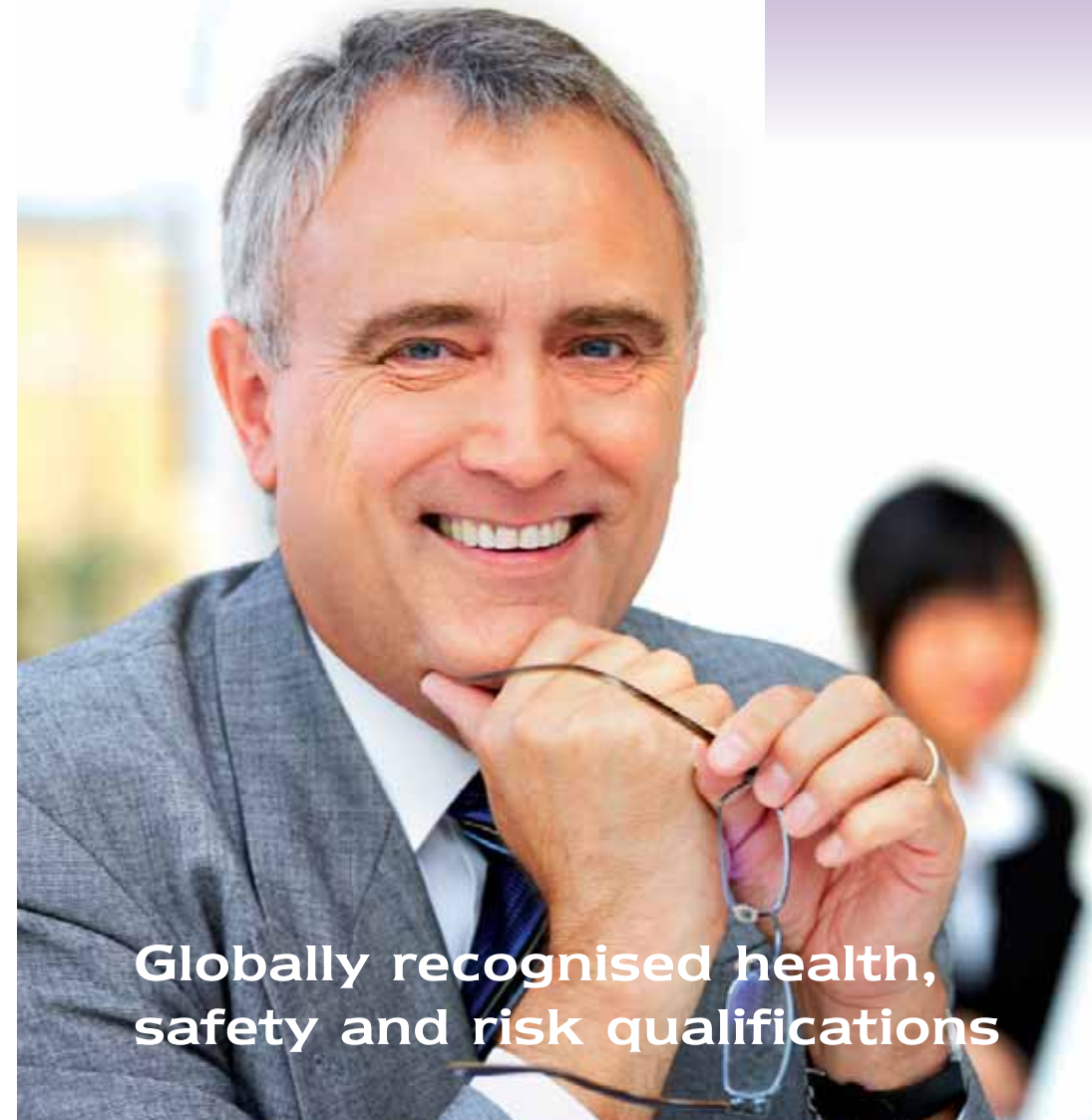

What kind of people take the NEBOSH Certificate in the Management of Health and Well-being at Work?

General Managers, Supervisors, HR Managers, and Safety Professionals, who have responsibility for, or involvement in, the health and well-being of employees as part of their day-to-day duties.

It is not intended as a primary qualification for occupational health practitioners.

What are the benefits for the organisation?

This new qualification will benefit companies in all sectors who are seeking to improve the efficiency, and morale of their workforce. The qualification equips managers to minimise absence, encourage people back to work where possible, and deal effectively with the health issues of their staff.

NEBOSH accredited course providers offer a variety of course formats enabling candidates and employers to arrange training around the needs of the business.



What does the course cover?

The syllabus is based on recognised best practice in management of health in the workplace, and includes:

- Managing absence and return to work
- Recognising and dealing with substance misuse
- Preventing stress and dealing with mental ill health at work
- Disability discrimination and protecting health at work
- Assessing risks to health at work
- Working effectively with health professionals
- Preventing and managing back pain.



How is the course assessed?

The syllabus is divided into two units:

Unit 1: Managing Health and Well-being in the Workplace, assessed via written examination.

Unit 2: Practical assessment based on identification of workplace health and well-being issues in the your own workplace.

How much does it cost?

Course fees are determined by your training provider and vary depending on the format of the course. Please contact providers for details.
